FOCUS ON FUNDAMENTALS The Gift of Laughter

Humor is an important part of our everyday lives. As a form of intellectual play, it grows more sophisticated with age. The kind of humor children express depends, in part, on the level of cognitive development they have achieved.

A child first experiences humor in the second year of life in the context of playing with objects. A 3-year old usually thinks it's hilarious to give objects or events names that she or he knows are incorrect. Most 4 year olds laugh at objects primarily on the basis of their appearance such as a drawing of a car with square tires.

Most 3-5 year olds don't understand many of the jokes, riddles or puns that seem funny to older children.

Humor is more than just a chuckle or a belly laugh. It releases pent-up energy and permits the expression of ideas and feelings. Growing up is stressful and good mental health which includes a sense of humor—shows children how to cope with sources of conflict and distress.

And what is the most joyful sound in the world—
A child's laughter.
