FINE MOTOR: During the month of January your child will be working on their fine motor skills by lacing, painting on an easel, buttoning, zipping, snapping and <u>tying their shoes</u>. The Writing Center will be a focus for this month, encouraging writing of first and last names.

LANGUAGE: Our Language curriculum will include the introduction of upper and lower case letters. We will continue to encourage the use of expanded vocabulary. The concept of print will be reviewed as well as working on story recall. The letter sounds of the month are I & S.

MATHEMATICS: In Math we will be reviewing ordinal numbers and environmental numbers—dates, price and time. Graphing will continue this month as well as making sets of 6,7,8,9,10. As part of our Math experience we will be combining, separating and problem solving using math objects. As part of the solar system we will be weighing and measuring. The students have been counting all year and we will be celebrating 100 DAYS OF SCHOOL on January 22nd, 2015.

SOCIAL/SCIENCE: In our Social Studies we will be covering space travel including the solar system. January is a perfect time to discuss different types of weather including ice and snow. As a review we will re-introduce globes and maps. We will also be introducing the Seven Continents. The students will be discussing types of attire that we wear during the different Seasons.
