2's/YOUNG THREE'S
AUGUST / SEPTEMBER MONTHLY CALENDAR

FINE MOTOR: During the month of August/September your child will be working on their fine motor skills by stringing beads, cutting play dough, tearing paper, scooping, pouring, gluing, and easel painting.

LANGUAGE: Language development will include story time and intro to concepts of print. The children will also be concentrating on learning their friends names and learning “All About Me”. We will be working on learning the days of the week and also the concept of what a calendar is. Our color for the month is RED.

MATHEMATICS: Our math skills will involve counting 1-10 as well as one to one correspondence using up to five objects and sorting objects. Our “All About Me Unit” will allow us to integrate our language and math skills as we weigh and measure ourselves. Look for many art projects involving the “circle” shape.

SOCIAL/SCIENCE: The students will continue to work on Life Skills – hand washing, cleaning up our classroom, and reviewing classroom rules. We will also be discussing our emotions. Emotions are an important part of our 3’s social development. We will continue helping them recognize their different feelings and how to act on them appropriately.

PLAYGROUND REMINDERS:

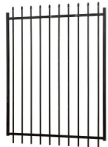
All children must wear closed toed, rubber soled shoes with socks to school. **NO BOOTS, CLOGS, CROCS, OR SANDALS.**

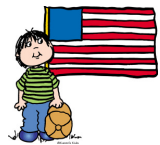


BACK GATE REMINDERS

DOES EVERYONE FEEL AS GUILTY AS I DO WHEN I LEAVE IN THE MORNING??

At one time or another every parent feels guilt about leaving a child in a child care center. It makes no difference whether it's a pre-school program, a Mother's Day Out, or full day care. Somehow working parents and single parents seem to suffer the most. They often ask themselves the hard questions: "Am I doing the right thing?" "Can I stop working?" "Should I stay home?" You are not alone, all parents feel this way. How you handle your feelings and emotions will help your child have a successful school year.

Tips for a Successful School Year:

1. Good feelings are contagious.

If you are genuinely enthusiastic about the first day, your child will look forward to it also.

2. Count on our staff members to help your family during this important times.

We know that every parent and every child adjusts differently. Therefore, dealing with separation will in essence be the curriculum for the first few day or even weeks, that your child is in our care.

3. Saying goodbye.

Reassure your child that you will be back to pick him/her up. Do not make promises you can't keep. If you tell your child "I will pick you up early", make sure you are there early to pick her/him up. Your word is taken as an unbreakable truth by your child. If your child cries or does not want you to leave, don't hang around even though it may break your heart to go. It will be easier for your child if you make the break quickly. Establish some arrival routines, put belongings in your child's cubby, or wave goodbye. **Always say goodbye with a kiss, hug or wave.** Be firm, but friendly and loving about leaving.

There is nothing in this world like seeing your child successfully take their first steps, grow and develop into their own special person. One of the ultimate measures of your success in life will be how good of a job you do in raising your child. This is not a burden or some cross to bear. It is one of life's greatest blessings. Enjoy this new journey with your child.
