FINE MOTOR: During the month of September your child will be working on their fine motor skills by cutting play dough, tearing paper, scooping, pouring, gluing, easel painting and creating a self portrait.

LANGUAGE: Language development will include story time and intro to concepts of print. The children will also be concentrating on learning their friends names. The students will be reviewing the days of the week, months of the year and the year.

MATHEMATICS: Our math skills will involve counting 1-20 as well as one to one correspondence using up to ten objects and sorting objects. The students will be working on their fine motor skills as well as recognizing & drawing the shapes: circle, oval, triangles, rectangles and squares. September is a great month for apples, we will be measuring, sorting and grafting apples.

SOCIAL/SCIENCE: In Science the students will be tasting apples and learning which apples are sweet and which are sour. Our Pre Kindergarten students will be learning about Johnny Applesseed an American pioneer nurseryman. The students will also be traveling by land, sea and air as they explore different types of transportation. We can't forget the Olympics this year - students will be participating in different activities in honor of our great athletes and maybe have their own competitions in their classroom. During Artist Week we will be discussing different Artist and using different art mediums to explore with.

All children must wear closed toed, rubber soled shoes with socks to school. NO BOOTS, CLOGS, CROCS, OR SANDALS.

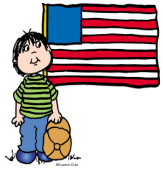
PLAYGROUND HOURS: Please be aware that our playground is not open for use by children unless it is their designated outside playtime and a staff member is present to supervise.

Your Four Year Old's Physical Milestone Checklist

- Walking confidently, one foot on each step, up and down stairs
- Using a bat and ball with confidence - she can now throw, catch and bounce a ball
- Climbing trees and ladders with ease
- Running at speed
- Jumping with two feet over objects
- Walking for a short distance along a line before falling off
- Pedaling well and may even be learning to ride a two-wheeler
- Hopping-although this is usually very wobbly
- Threading beads
- Learning how to swing himself

Remember! All children are different and develop at different rates, so don't be overly concerned if your preschooler is acquiring new skills at a different rate to those around him/her.

Are you prepared?

3. Do you know your evacuation zone? You can find it on the Pinellas County Emergency Management website.

How we will notify you.

1. We will be monitoring any upcoming weather reports and update our families using:
 - A. Facebook
 - B. Text messaging: if we have your phone carrier.
 - C. By Phone: if we are in school and the weather changes quickly.
 - D. We will put a message on our phone system.
 - E. Flyers

School Closure:

New Horizons does not follow the Pinellas County Schools when it comes to closing our school. We will close if a State of Emergency has been declared for Pinellas County or the school has to be closed due to street flooding, damage, loss of electricity, water or lack of staff due to the weather conditions.

New Horizons will keep our families informed about the current weather conditions. However we depend on our families to stay informed of changing weather and pick up their children if weather conditions become severe.
